Dear Parents.


Below is a continuation of the article "Teaching Kids to be Problem Solvers"

How can we develop problem solving skills in our children? If your child is faced with a problem, sort through possibilities together by asking questions.

- · Ask "what could you do?" "What would happen if you did this?..."
- Let them try out possibilities on their own first give them the chance to try out their solutions even if you know they may not work!
- Treat difficulties as though you are both trying to solve it together.
- Discuss situations together by using reflective listening ("it sounds as though you had a tough day today")
- Let children discover life through trial and error this is vital to develop resilience!
- Let children make lots of MISTAKES! We don't want to protect children from difficult
 emotions as they need to cope with them at some stage of their lives.
- Step back when mistakes are made. (Only step in if you have to!)
- Give children chances to develop independence by allowing them to make small decisions and larger ones as they grow. (concluded next time)

The teachers have been using various scenarios to teach this focus including the following :

- A teacher asks child to stop talking and stay focused on your work
- Showing respect for office staff e.g. asking for an ice pack
- Visiting another classroom to borrow something off the teacher
- A teacher on playground duty asks child to put your hat on
- Arriving late to class

Please talk to your child about this focus.

The children receive a PBS4L Token for responsible behaviour and each token earns a point for their colour house. Progress chart is in the display cabinet outside the Library. The first team to reach 500 points will receive a reward.

INFANTS CROSS COUNTRY Tuesday 27th March

On Tuesday, March 27th the children from years K, 1 & 2 will be participating in a short cross country course. Parents are very welcome to attend and times are as follows:

Year 2 - 9:15 am Year 1 - 11:30 am Kindergarten - 2:15 pm

Times are staggered due to the children's sport times.

Parents are asked to assemble in the Kiss and Drop area and a teacher will open the gates just before the race. Parents are welcome to bring a fold up chair. The event will not take any longer than 20 minutes.

Cross country is a component of the PD/H/PE Syllabus and it is compulsory for every child to participate.

The children in Year 2 are very welcome to back up the following day and compete in the School Cross Country (2 kms). Children turning 8 years of age can qualify for the Zone Cross Country if they finish in the top 6 of the school race. This is not compulsory however and is only if you have super keen runners who can go the distance!

OLOR IS NUT FREE

We have an increasing number of children in our school who suffer from an anaphylaxis reaction to certain foods etc. but in particular, nuts.

To assist in our duty of care for these children, direct nut products or products that list nuts as an actual ingredient, eg. peanut butter and nutella, are not permitted at Our Lady of the Rosary School. Please also keep this vigilance when sending in birthday cakes, cupcakes and other confectionary for whatever purpose. Additionally, we will continue to ask that children not to share their food.



EVERY DAY MATTERS

CHANGES TO STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS: COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 years attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Extended Leave from attendance for student absence and travel

- 1-4 days absence: Parents **must** notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date.
- 5 or more days absence: Parents must complete and submit the <u>Application for Extended Leave</u> form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application). If approved the Principal issues a <u>Certificate of Extended Leave</u>. If the Principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

- Open Skoolbag app 1.
- Click on eForms 2.
- 3. Select Absentee Form
- 4. Complete all fields
- In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen 5.
- Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES - NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY <u>ALL</u> PARENT VOLUNTEERS <u>INCLUDING THOSE WHO</u> ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the 'Volunteer Form' and the 'Module' have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

'Building Child Safe Communities' is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. It is now a requirement that <u>all</u> volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form that confirms expectations in relation to behavior whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centers. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

Volunteers – please click on 'Building Child Safe Communities – Undertaking for Volunteers' by accessing the **form** via the Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta public webpage www.parra.catholic.edu.au, then click on

the 'Volunteers and Contractors-Click here' image (halfway down page on the right hand side). This image will take you to the Building Safe Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 1—Volunteer Form and follow the steps

You will receive a confirmation email once the form has been submitted.

- Your details will be maintained confidentially in a central database
- A copy of your confirmation will then be emailed to the School / location where you are volunteering to be kept on file.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.



<u>www.parra.catholic.edu.au</u>, then click on the 'Volunteers and Contractors-Click here' image (halfway down page on the right hand side). This image will take you to the Building Safe Communities page.

Click on the green Volunteer tab (left hand side)

Click on Step 2—Complete the Online Training Module

Once you complete this online module the school will receive notification that it has been completed and you will be cleared to volunteer.

Therefore in brief:

- 1. To complete form go to: www.parra.catholic.edu.au and follow Step 1 above
- 2. Wait for confirmation email
- 3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
