It is with great pleasure that I inform the community that our building plans are now formalised and the Tender process will begin in the next few weeks. Our timeline is still on track which means that the building will commence during the Term 3 holiday break.

The CEDP team, the team from Alleanza Architecture, Father Alejandro and our school team have been planning together for many months to ensure that our buildings support our vision and Diocesan direction.

We are striving to provide our students with an environment that will support optimal learning, comfort and security and also reflects the Franciscan and Mercy ethos of our school. We are proud of our long history of respecting each other, the environment and ourselves.

The learning environments will be bright, self sufficient and spacious. They will address the needs of all our students and be flexible enough to allow spaces to be configured to address the changing needs of each learning group. Each space will incorporate Maker Spaces, a fully equipped kitchen, break out spaces, outdoor learning areas as well as gardens designed to develop the inquisitive mind. We are conscious of the need for our students to play and learn in environments that allow them to discover, climb, build and plan collaboratively with their peers. They need to be able to not only run and play games but also find areas that are calm and safe for those that like quiet play.

We are very aware that a great deal of planning will and is already going into ensuring that all the students in our school are safe, comfortable and happy during the building period. We are fortunate that we have enough space in our school to rehouse grades comfortably. We have already planned a timeline and procedures to guide us when, where and how the Year 3, 5 and 6 students will be moving to their spaces.

Please know that we are experienced professionals, supported and guided by the CEDP as well as our Architects. We thank you for the support and trust you place in us. We know that our whole community is looking forward to providing our students with the exciting and beautiful learning spaces that we will have at OLOR in the near future.

The plans will all be available to be viewed in our library from Monday morning (27th August). We will leave the plans displayed for a period of time to allow parents to see the plans at their convenience. Please feel free to come in and talk to us should you wish any clarification around the plans or the organisation around this project. We will also continue to share the Architects' drawings on school bag and Facebook so that members of our community who can't come into the school can view them at leisure.

News from Sr Antoinette

Dear Parents,
We have much to be thankful for as we move along this term. My sharing with you this week is again from Michael Grose:

Five practical tips to promote a sense of responsibility in your kids:

1. Start from an early age. Children as young as three are keen to help and take some responsibility but we often push them away and say, 'You can help when you're older.' Train your kids from a young age to make a contribution so it becomes habit-forming. Remember, not every child will help equally. If your children are school-aged and do very little to help, then start with a few jobs each day and gradually increase the number.
2. Give kids responsibility that scares or surprises you. A neighbour gets her four year old to unpack her dishwasher each morning, plates and all. Another parent I know gets her five year old to help her younger sister get her breakfast each morning. Another gives over the weekly garbage to ten year old with no reminders whatsoever. In each case, the kids rise to the challenge set by their parents. Give your child or teenager something that makes you think, 'NO WAY!' He can't do that! Kids will often surprise adults with what they can do.
3. Make sure the responsibility is real. Setting the table, making beds, tidying rooms are jobs that others benefit from. Giving kids jobs because you think it's good for them just don't cut it with kids. However giving jobs that others rely on teaches them that their help is needed.
4. If a child forgets then no one else does the task. If a child doesn't empty the dishwasher then it still there when they come home from school. Sounds tough but that's how the real world operates. When you empty it, it becomes your responsibility. When we're time-strapped it's usually easier to do kids' jobs for them. Nothing wrong with this once in a while as we help each other out in families. However, if you are always doing a child's job then it may as well be yours.
5. Place help and responsibility on a roster. The use of rosters has the advantage of placing responsibility on to kids and takes you out of the picture. Remind them to check the roster, not to do their jobs! It's a subtle but important difference. "


A THOUGHT

LOST PROPERTY: One area of focus as part of our PBS4L is " Respect for our Belongings". Generally most of the children are very responsible for their belongings and everything is clearly marked with their name, class etc. Unfortunately this is not always the case and the Lost Property area can have lots of jackets, hats, lunch boxes, drink bottles to be claimed - mostly unmarked, and amounting to hundreds of dollars.

Therefore I am asking that everything be clearly marked. The best way to mark jackets and hats is to use iron - on or sew - on name tags - clearly a cost, but nothing compared to the cost of a new jacket or hat.

The staff are constantly encouraging the children to be responsible and want to work in co-operation with you the parents. Your attention to this would be greatly appreciated.

Parking Rules & Penalties

Council's Compliance Officers enforce parking signs at your school.

When it comes to the safety of vulnerable road users like school children, drivers found breaking the law will be met with zero tolerance. When an offence is detected, you will be fined.



NO STOPPING

You must not STOP at any time.

Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points



BUS ZONES

You must not stop your vehicle in a Bus Zone unless you are driving a public bus.

Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points



NO PARKING

You can stop only to drop off or pick up passengers or goods and you must not stop for more than 2 minutes and The driver must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle. Stopping includes when the vehicle is not moving but the engine is still running.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$187 and 2 demerit points



DRIVEWAYS

You must not park your car over or block access to a driveway. You can stop in a driveway to drop off or pick up passengers BUT only for less than 2 minutes AND the driver must stay with the car.

SCHOOL ZONE

Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points

There are now increased penalties and demerit points associated with all offences in School Zones.

	NO PARKING You have no more than 2 minutes for drop-offs or pick-ups and must stay within 3 metres of your vehicle.	Penalty from \$187 and 2 demerit points
	NO STOPPING Under no circumstances are you permitted to stop on a length of road to which a No Stopping Sign applies.	Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points
	BUS ZONE You must not stop your vehicle in the indicated zone unless you are driving a public bus.	Penalty from \$337 and 2 demerit points

Stop on path or nature strip	\$337 & 2 demerit points
Stop on / near marked pedestrian/children's crossing	\$439 & 2 demerit points

We have an increasing number of children in our school who suffer from an anaphylaxis reaction to certain foods etc. but in particular, nuts.

CHANGES TO STUDENT LEAVE APPLICATIONS: COMPULSORY SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

The Catholic Education Office Diocese of Parramatta (CEDP) has procedures and guidelines in place to achieve high standards of student attendance in collaboration with parents. Parents are required by law to ensure that children aged between 6 and 17 years attend school. Schools are required to monitor and keep a register of student attendance and explained absences.

Requirements for Extended Leave from attendance for student absence and travel

- 1-4 days absence: Parents **must** notify the school principal by mail or email (written) at least 2 weeks before leave date.
- 5 or more days absence: Parents must complete and submit the [*Application for Extended Leave*](#) form at least 2 weeks prior to commencing leave (Copies of travel documents must accompany this application). If approved the Principal issues a [*Certificate of Extended Leave*](#). If the Principal declines this application (i.e it is not within the best interest of the child to take leave and be absent from school), a letter notifying parents that the application has been declined would be forthcoming.

HAVING ISSUES WITH THE Skoolbag app

If you find you are not receiving messages or have lost your alert ping, sometimes it is just a matter of removing and re-installing the app.

System updates sometimes cause these minor issues.



USE YOUR Skoolbag app TO NOTIFY YOUR CHILD'S ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

1. Open Skoolbag app
2. Click on eForms
3. Select Absentee Form
4. Complete all fields
5. In the last field you need to tap and then you can sign with your finger on your phone screen
6. Press Submit

This will send an instant email to the school to advise your child's absence.

This document is now legally acceptable as an Absentee Notification as the form is signed. You will not need to send in an additional note when your child returns to school.

This eForm is not to be used for extended Family leave.

BUILDING CHILD SAFE COMMUNITIES – NEW FORMS FOR ALL VOLUNTEERS

THIS FORM MUST BE COMPLETED BY ALL PARENT VOLUNTEERS INCLUDING THOSE WHO ALREADY HAVE A CURRENT NSW WORKING WITH CHILDREN CHECK.

Please note: Until both the ‘Volunteer Form’ and the ‘Module’ have been completed, parents will not be able to assist in any capacity as a volunteer within the school. (The school receives notification when you complete each section).

‘Building Child Safe Communities’ is a new initiative developed by Catholic Education Diocese of Parramatta that enhances our commitment to ensuring the safety and wellbeing of all students in our care. **It is now a requirement that all volunteers and contractors complete an online undertaking form** that confirms expectations in relation to behavior whilst volunteering or contracting at schools, Catholic Out of Schools Hours Care and Catholic Early Learning Centers. This undertaking form also seeks to determine the suitability of volunteers and contractors by requiring them to declare that they do not have a criminal history involving children.

A new form is required:

- For each location that you are a volunteer or contractor
- If any of the details you have provided on the form change

A reminder that you once you receive your confirmation email, you will need to complete the Child Protection Module.

2. Wait for confirmation email
3. On receipt of the confirmation email follow Step 2 above to complete Child Protection Online Module
4. Wait for confirmation email
5. The School will receive an email confirming that you have completed both steps and are now cleared to volunteer.
